Ironer Safety Part II More Recommendations
for Laundry Management

Here are additional insights with ironer safety expert Pat Teague:

Q: How Should Operators Apply Wax to the Ironer Chests, and What Safety Precautions Should They Take?

A: Ironer wax should be applied before plant start-up, during morning and afternoon breaks and during lunches. Waxing should only be performed by designated personnel who are properly trained to do so. Waxing involves the handling of hot cloths and wax. Thus, there is a risk of burns.



We recommend that trained personnel be members of the maintenance crew and/or supervisors who have had the proper training to perform this task. Your ironer supplier/service company should be able to provide this training. In multiple ironer plants, there should be at least one wax cloth per two ironers.
